Do you attend worship services regularly? I know there are many of you who can answer that question yes. But there are also many who would have to say no. I wonder why that is?

There is never any pressure from us to attend worship. Trying to guilt people into coming would be a waste of time anyway. The real question is why do people come to worship at all.

It can't be to be entertained. We are not in competition with football or Sunday morning talk shows or good tee times. There is something more significant here than just having a good time. There is a command from God that we should put God first on our priority list and that we should look forward to a chance to gather with others to offer praise to God. Nobody is strong enough spiritually

to walk the walk of faith alone.

There may be some very good reasons for you to miss worship. But there are also excuses (like the ones above) that come down to your desire to put God first in your life. Nobody is taking attendance. You won't get a nasty letter saying shame on you. It's really between your soul and the God who gives you life. Put God first and just watch as everything else falls into place. I'll see you in church!

Leading psychologist Charles Fernyhough blends the most current science with literature and personal stories in *Pieces of Light: How the New Science of Memory Illuminates the Stories We Tell About Our Pasts.*


Stewardship Campaign for 2014 Raise the Roof!





