Dear Friends.

I have a brief story to tell you of something that happened in my conversation with your Interim Pastor Search Committee.

We were near the end of our second interview (and this was on Skype, where one often sees only two of four people). I was answering questions for perhaps 30 or 40 minutes. The Committee then said, "Do you have any questions for us?"

And I asked, "Would you mind sharing how each of you came to the First Presbyterian Church of New Vernon?" I am always curious how people choose or end up at churches. Each of your committee members spent a few minutes telling their story. My second question was, "Did you know that about each other before this?" And there were some chuckles. Some things were known, but for the most part, the answer was no, not really.

If my memory serves me correctly, it was that day, or the next, that Jane Coyle called me on my cell (as I was driving through Atlanta) and asked if I would be your Interim Pastor.

I have no idea what other qualified candidates you had in your files. I had four other churches talking to me from different parts of the country. Maybe I was all you had left! But I doubt it. I think rather someone in your committee said something like, "Let's get that guy."

I do know from my side of it, after that second interview, I was thinking, "I want to go there."

There are all kinds of moments we get nudged one way or another, by life or by God. In this case, I don't believe it was my wowing you with my qualifications to be your Interim Pastor, or your impressing me with how wonderful your church is. I believe instead something happened between us in that brief time of

sharing: an experience of community. I know it did for me. And I think this is at the heart of what it means to be a church: people sharing their lives in the context of their faith. We learn and study and grow through worship, Bible study, theology, missions, and caring. But it is the connections we make with each other as people of faith that give us energy and inspiration to do all that. This is what I hope for in my time with you.

Committee Highlights

Beginning on October 12, services will be held in Fellowship Hall while the necessary repairs are being made to the sanctuary.

Worship & Music: We have had an interesting array of visiting ministers from the middle of June until the end of September. Starting October 5, we eagerly anticipate the arrival of our new Interim Minister, Robert Gamble. We also have musical entertainment: Ming Xie's Piano Recital on September 28; An Evening of Opera on Friday, October 3 at 7pm. Min Kwon will be playing Carnegie Hall on Monday night October 6 at 7:30.

Finance: We are in sound shape financially. Our tenants had fallen on rough times, however, we are happy to report they are back on their feet. Through the kindness and patience of the church they were given a payment plan, which they have been able to adhere to and for which they are grateful. The parameters guiding the distribution of the educational fund, aka the HERB Fund, will be jointly reviewed by deacons and session.

Congregational Life: There will be a luncheon after church on October 5 to welcome the Gambles. The annual Harvest Celebration will be held at Aimee Bloom's house on October 19 at 3pm. The Christmas Dinner will be December 7, details to follow. Small group gatherings are being scheduled for the Gambles to afford them the opportunity to meet church members in a more intimate environment

Cemetery: The cemetery grounds were landscaped over the summer; unsightly shrubs, branches and other items placed or planted at the gravesites were removed. The Memorial Garden is in need of repair; there is a large crack in the back wall, made worse by our harsh winter. A new sign, listing the rules of the cemetery, is on order. The website will list updated costs for all cemetery related services.

Youth Education: The Ministry Architects met with the vision team and various church members. During the meeting, a mission statement, core values and present and future goals for our youth group were outlinded. We will hopefully have an interim Sunday School teacher by the new year, in the meantime Katherine Anne Newburg has agreed to help with the program. The youth need a space to meet, on site options are being considered.

Adult Education: Dennis Corcoran gave a very informative presentation on Pope Francis. Barbara Coe will present on the emotional approach to Christianity, at the end of October. In November, Greg Porraro, will speak on the benefits of environmentally conscious housing.

Administration & Communication: Debbie Hennessey developed a new <u>pcnv.org</u> website over the summer using Sharefaith's award-winning church website editor. Sharefaith provides a cost-effective solution to our growing technological needs on a *WordPress* based platform. It is also simple enough for a novice user while still allowing more advanced users to use html code for customization.

Buildings & Grounds: Phil Van Kirk will be the point person for all issues related to the brick manse and the pastor's manse. Don Vellekamp will oversee the repairs to the sanctuary.

Stewardship: *Crossroads* 500! is the name of this year's stewardship campaign and it is in full swing. Please send in your pledge cards promptly.

Membership: Ann Talcott and Patty Wood have been sending out birthday cards to church members. Distribution of welcome bags for new Harding residents has been discontinued due to low impact and impracticality.

Nominating: It's nominating season once again. We have several opening for Elders, Deacons and other Committees, if you are interested in being a part of this very important mission please contact the church office or Jane Coyle.

Communion will be served on Sunday, October 5. The next meeting of session will be on Tuesday, October 21. Reverend Halldorson adjourned the meeting with prayer.

New pcnv.org Website

Over the summer, Caroline Ford, the Admin/Communications Chair and the Session gave Debbie Hennessey the go-ahead to set-up the Church's website, <u>pcnv.org</u>, on a WordPress based church website editor created by ShareFaith (a Ministry Media Resource for churches and faith communities). The site is still being developed, but it is scheduled to launch the first week in October.

On the Home Page, in addition to the navigation bar on the top of the page, you will find a quick link to *The Pipe Organ* page where you can download the current edition, as well as issues

from the past three years. There is also a link to our Facebook page and image links to events that are coming soon at the bottom of the page. If you mouse over the images, you will see the name of the event pop up.

We will also be uploading Dr. Gamble's sermons in the weeks to come and there will be a weekly or monthly blog by Dr. Gamble under Devotions (found on the top Navigation bar).

Most Committees have submitted information about their mission and activities. Please take a few minutes to read what they have to say. In addition, on the Office Administration page you will be able to download Usher Instructions, Coffee Hour Instructions, Payment /Reiimbursement Vouchers, Use of Building Applications, as well as forms for Baptisms, Weddings, New Members, and Consent Forms for using Pictures on the website. Our goal is to make the website helpful to you and if you have suggestions for what would make it better for you, please email Debbie Hennessey at officeadmin@pcn.org and let her know. Also found on the Administration page are the office staff bios with a brief job description. On the Music and Worship pages there are bios for Amanda and Elena, our Music staff.

There are a few ways to find out about events and scheduled activities on the website. Dates, times, and event names can be found on the Calendar page. Date, times, event names and a brief description can be found on the Events page. Many of the events on the Events page have links to more information in the description of the event. Also, many Committees have their own page. On them, links can be found in sidebars on the left side of the page if a committee has special activities or has submitted more in-depth information. An example of this is the Adult Education page where you will find links for Bible Studies, Movie Night, the Book Club, and scheduled Sunday events.

There is also a search feature at the top right corner of each page. Type in a key word and click on the image of the magnifying glass and it will take you to all incidents of that key word on the website. It is our hope that you will find the website useful and that it will be a tool that helps promote our churches' growth in the years to come.



The Wrong Enemy by Carlotta Gall

Ms. Gall has reported from Afghanistan and Pakistan for almost the entire duration of the American invasion and occupation, beginning shortly after 9/11. She knows just how much this war has cost the Afghan people, and how much damage can be traced to Pakistan and its

duplicitous government and intelligence forces. Now that American troops are withdrawing, it is time to tell the full history of how we have been fighting the wrong enemy, in the wrong country.

Gall combines searing personal accounts of battles and betrayals with moving portraits of the ordinary Afghanis who endured a terrible war of more than a decade. Her firsthand accounts of Taliban warlords, Pakistani intelligence thugs, American generals, Afghani politicians, and the many innocents who were caught up in this long war are riveting. Her evidence that Pakistan fueled the Taliban and protected Osama bin Laden is revelatory. This is a sweeping account of a war brought by well-intentioned American leaders against an enemy they barely understood, and could not truly engage.—Book description from Amazon.cum

Stewardship Campaign for 2014-2015 "Crossroads 500!"


