move in that direction and be found and greeted by our regular members.

And I know, it feels more like camp in there with our folding chairs and wooden floor, but camp always was the place life was spontaneous, faith nourished, and friendships cherished. Look for that to happen in these months in Fellowship Hall; make it a beautiful time together.

# Christmas Donations

## Morris County Correctional Facility

### Drop-off deadline is December 17

The following is a list of items that have been approved to be donated for the approximately 400 inmates' Christmas gift bags this year.

- Men's white **crew** neck t-shirts in lg, X-lg, 2X, and 3X  
(*no V-necks or pockets allowed*)
- Men's white briefs
- White crew socks
- Envelope with a check made out to **Chaplaincy Program of MCCF** for \$10 or more for toiletry items (these products will be purchased by coordinators so that all gifts will be the same brand/size/color, etc.)
- Home-baked cookies (5 cookies per plastic baggie—no frosting or metal tins, please)

The above items are the **only ones** that will be accepted by security. Please **do not gift wrap** your donations.

The holidays are an especially difficult time for inmates and their families. This is a time when your generosity will truly touch the hearts of the men and women who are incarcerated at MCCF. Your acts of kindness may be seen by a prisoner as the brightest beacon of God's love.



### No Time to Bake Cookies?

Nancy Barrett's young neighbor, who likes to bake, will bake cookies for the jail for \$20 a batch. Each batch is about 38 nice-sized cookies. ## OCTOBER SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

### October 21, 2014 Meeting



The meeting began with Tom Ewig leading devotions.

**Worship & Music:** There were several musical events presented over the past month, which were received with enthusiasm and appreciation. The Christmas Program is currently being planned. This year, Christmas services will be held at the traditional times of 5:00 pm and 11:00 pm.

**Mission & Outreach:** There will be a food drive for Homeless Solutions and Transitional Housing; boxes for food donations will be available in Fellowship Hall. 17 bikes plus shipping costs were donated to Pedals for Progress. **Finance:** There are some delays to the sanctuary stabilization project. Asbestos removal, which was not foreseen, and the acquisition of needed permits held up the contractor. The estimated time of the project has been increased from 4 to 5 months. We should be back in the sanctuary by early April. There has been some discussion about whether to keep the pool at the manse or demolish it. This discussion is still open and will be continued in the spring.

**Congregational Life:** The luncheon for Robert and Yulia, on his first Sunday in the pulpit, was a great success due in part to the volunteers who pitched in and helped. Thank you! This year, due to our displacement from the sanctuary, our Christmas meal will be a dinner rather than a luncheon to be held on December 7. It would be most helpful for attendees to RSVP. It is very challenging for the Committee to plan the menu when the number of attendees is more than double the responses. Please sign up or respond via email if you plan to come.

**Youth Education:** Katherine Ann Newburg has been hired as the new interim Sunday School director. Katherine Ann recently graduated with a degree in elementary education; she is the daughter of Thursday morning Bible study leader Kevin Newburg. A senior high mission trip is scheduled for next summer. There are some great opportunities for our youth over the long weekend in November. In addition to helping the Gambles with some painting in their new home, they will prepare meals-to-go for the Morristown Soup Kitchen, and they will cook for and serve soup to the poor and the homeless living in Harlem. There will be one youth mission activity scheduled per month, enabling our youth to bond while helping others.

**Adult Education:** We had the pleasure of hosting some excellent speakers in October. In November, in addition to Greg Porraro speaking on environmental living, we will have the opportunity to hear from Herman Scott from the Morristown Correctional Facility on November 23. He will also supply a list of some items that the inmates need.

**Communication & Administration:** The new website has officially been launched! Debbie will maintain the calendar and update the website when new information is provided.

**Stewardship:** Many pledges have been sent in, but many more are still missing. If you sent in your pledge, thank you; if not, please do so as soon as you can. We will hear testimonials from some members of the congregation in the coming month.

**Membership:** The Committee will host a small dinner for the Gambles. Small groups for discussion and fellowship will be formed so that the Gambles can meet all members in a more casual and intimate environment.

**Nominating:** The Nominating Committee is still working on filling the openings on the Board of Deacons and Session. The mission study is currently being developed. Communion will be served on Sunday, Nov 2. The next meeting of Session will be on Tuesday, Nov 18. Dr. Gamble adjourned the meeting with prayer.

They also develop permanent supportive housing that is energy efficient for very low, low, and moderate income families and individuals. They provided affordable housing to 133 people in 2013. *Flash Boys is about a small group of Wall Street guys who figure out that the U.S. stock market has been rigged for the benefit of insiders and that, post-financial crisis, the markets have become not more free but less, and more controlled by the big Wall Street banks. Working at different firms, they come to this realization separately; but after they discover one another, the flash boys band together and set out to reform the financial markets. This they do by creating an exchange in which high-frequency trading—source of the most intractable problems—will have no advantage whatsoever.*

*The characters in Flash Boys are completely different from what you think of when you think “Wall Street guy.” Several have walked away from jobs in the financial sector that paid them millions of dollars a year. From their new vantage point they investigate the big banks, the world’s stock exchanges, and high-frequency trading firms, and expose the many strange new ways that Wall Street generates profits.*

*The light that Lewis shines into the darkest corners of the financial world may not be good for your blood pressure, because if you have any contact with the market, even a retirement account, this story is happening to you. But in the end, Flash Boys is an uplifting read. Here are people who have somehow preserved a moral sense in an environment where you don’t get paid for that; they have perceived an institutionalized injustice and are willing to go to war to fix it.*


# Stewardship Campaign for 2015


