### Rick's Reflections

Christopher Hitchens was an articulate proponent of atheism. He was a very intelligent and well educated man who wrote books and articles about how absurd the idea of God was to anyone who had any wisdom at all. He is now dead. All that he was and all the thoughts that he thought died with him. He did not live long enough to understand a deeper wisdom: the wisdom of God.

Human beings are given a wonderful gift by the creator. We are given minds that can contemplate life's meaning and origins. We have the mental capacity to make great discoveries and solve difficult riddles. But so many of us seem to lack the ability to acknowledge that there is a higher form of wisdom: the wisdom of God.

If we accept our culture's definition of wisdom and power, we will not be on the same level as the wisdom that Paul explains in his letter to the church at Corinth.

Take crucifixion, for example. It would be foolish from a human perspective to consider one who was executed in such a way to be a victor. But God's wisdom is greater than human wisdom. God's wisdom tells us that, in that crucifixion, God reconciled the world to God's love. Does that make any sense? It does to God. And Paul says that, when we open our minds to God's wisdom, it begins to make sense to us too. To those who are busy dying, like Mr. Hitchens, it is foolishness. But to those of us who are being saved by God's grace, it is the power of God.

In this Holy week, we will replay the events of long ago. We will feel the shadows lengthen on Thursday night. We will feel the terror of Friday's darkness. We will watch through an empty Saturday. And we will rejoice in an empty tomb on Sunday. Through it all, we will learn once again the wisdom of God. The cross IS the power of God. The wisdom of God has the final word on death, and we live in the eternal season of Easter. Don't be fooled by what humans call wisdom. Trust God's wisdom. He died for us. He is risen. That is God's wisdom.

### Out of the Deep

recently heard from a friend of mine named Kelley who told me of a whale watch trip she took during a recent trip to Hawaii. If you've never been on a successful whale watch, it's something you need to do. If you have experienced the sighting of whales, then you know the unique feeling you get when you encounter these behemoths of our oceans.

Whales are wild. They're not trained. Sometimes they show up, and sometimes they don't, but they're always out there below the surface of the waves. On an average whale watch excursion, I would guess that people get to see a handful of these magnificent creatures, and some companies even guarantee sightings. Kelley was extremely fortunate on her trip. It ends up she went out with a non-profit research/preservation group, rather than a commercial company, and estimates their group must have seen 80-100 whales! In addition, her group saw at least ten, full, out-of-the-water breaches! Even the crew exclaimed that, on a scale of 1 to 10, this particular trip was a 27!

The crew members were actually scrambling for their cameras when this enormous Humpback whale started "playing" with Kelley's boat! Understand, the law requires that boats stay at least one hundred yards away from any whales. Problem is, no one told this whale! In cases where these gentle giants wander in nearby a boat, the crew is required to shut down the engines and wait for the whale to move on and away from the boat. On Kelley's trip, a huge (and she emphasizes HUGE) fellow surfaced about two feet from the side of the boat during the return trip. It then proceeded to go under the boat and come up on the other side and continue doing so, back-and-forth and back-and-forth, pleasantly holding the watchers "hostage" for at least an extra half hour with an absolutely amazing display!

Needless to say, Kelley arrived back in port a changed woman. There's something deep inside all of us that is touched when we experience communion with another creature, especially one that is so vast and unfamiliar. It affects the way we view our place in this world and our scope of the complexity of the world around us.

Do you know where I'm going with this? Sometimes we encounter God in a similar manner. We can hear of this immeasurable, indescribable, creator of the universe and be told he exists and loves us beyond what we could ever imagine. That's one way to know God. But... when he interjects himself into our lives in a visible manner, it floors us. We are awestruck, absolutely amazed, that such a vast God could actually have a personal interest in us. There are God-moments that occur in our own lives when we can truly sense God at work, right beside us. These moments, these experiences, are indescribable and fill us with a sensation of wonder.


